







COACHES CORNER

Trevor's Corner



This week we spoke to Trevor about the generations of TWBA campers that he's helped coach and the lessons he teaches. What has been your favourite memory or experience in basketball?:


Practices when they were able to play fun games.

OFF THE COURT PROGRAMS

STEM PROGRAM





This week's STEM activity was creating invisible ink! Campers were able to make "ink" out of water and baking soda, and then write messages on blank pieces of paper using cotton swabs. When the paper dried, it appeared completely blank. Following that, they brushed turmericdyed water over the paper, which made the messages visible. The campers were really shocked and excited at the results of the experiment, and had a lot of fun coming up with messages and seeing those messages finally appear on the paper. Experiments of this nature are so useful because they allow young campers to interact with science in a safe, fun and simple way.

TUTORING PROGRAM

This year, we were fortunate enough to speak to one of our campers, Harmony, who attended the Trevor Williams Kids Foundation tutoring program, Study Zone, throughout the school year. Ever since Covid-19, the Study Zone has taken place online, but previously took place after school at Westmount High School. In the past year, the tutoring program has expanded to multiple schools across Montreal. Harmony explained to us that her experience was really positive, because she knew she could rely on her tutor, Blaire, who is actually a part of the newsletter team, for support in subjects like French. Harmony explained that the Study Zone was an extremely helpful and supportive resource outside of her school and teachers.

On the Off-the-Court program we have Kaleesia and Nilani who have been tutors. Nilani says that tutoring is so important because, especially in public systems like Westmount High, it might be hard to have a personal connection with the teachers. This program ensures that the students are receiving closer and more personal help.

Meet the coordinators




Name: Kaleesia Age: 18 years old




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
